Major Accomplishments

- 149 people were served at LCI in 2007-2008
- 20 individuals placed in competitive employment in the community
- 80% of ADVP participants performed paid work at LCI at least 2 times per week
- 32% of day program participants completed a level on the annual CASAS test, administered by the Community College.
- 24% of day program participants improved on the annual CASAS test
- LCI implemented a Seniors program, which provides alternative activities for program participants age 50 and over
- Program participants and staff are making and selling their arts and crafts at a booth in the Shops of Steele Street in downtown Sanford

Safety Awards

- The Department of Labor presented LCI with its Safety Award for the 10th consecutive year.
- Achieved renewal of Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program Award (SHARP) from Dept of Labor. LCI is the only organizations in Sanford to achieve the SHARP Safety Award!
- LCI's fire inspection by the Lee County Fire Marshall noted no violations.
